Parent Corner

Video Games

Many children come to school excited to tell the teachers about their new video games. Though the teachers have no issue with students playing them, a concern arises when students are playing games that has content not suited for children.

Below are the rating categories. Please ensure that children are playing games appropriate for their age. The violence, and killing in some games is unhealthy for younger children and leads children to think that the content viewed in the video games is acceptable behavior with other students.

Rating Categories

All video game cases show a rating. Make sure you look at the rating before purchasing a game because <u>many video games are not suitable for children.</u>

EARLY CHILDHOOD - Content is intended for young children. Examples are **Dora, Sesame Street, and Bubble Guppies.**

EVERYONE - Content is for all ages. The games may contain mild violence. Examples are **Lego games**, **Mariokart**, and **NBA**.

TEEN - Content is for ages 13 and up. The games contain violence, crude humor, blood, gambling and offensive language. Examples are **Guitar Hero**, inFamous, and **Battlefield**.

MATURE - Content is suitable only for adults ages 18 and up. The games contain intense violence, blood and gore, sexual content and offensive language. *Students should not have access to these games*. Examples are Grand Theft Auto, Call of Duty, Medal of Honor, Halo, Assassin's Creed, and Fallout.
